FMPA is ... Florida Municipal Power Agency (FMPA) is a wholesale power agency owned by municipal electric utilities. FMPA's mission is to provide power that is competitively priced, reliable and clean as well as provide value-added services for its owner-customers.

Each utility is locally owned and operated. However, municipal utilities share common concerns that can best be solved by working together. For example, by coordinating the power supply needs of several municipals, a larger, more efficient plant can be built and other economies of scale help reduce the cost of power.

Authority FMPA is authorized by Florida Statutes to undertake joint electric projects and to issue tax-exempt bonds and other obligations to finance the costs of such projects.

Membership Thirty-one municipal electric systems, serving approximately 2.6 million Floridians, are members of FMPA. Each member appoints one representative to FMPA's Board of Directors, which governs the Agency's activities.

Projects FMPA has six power supply projects that provide all the power needs of 13 cities and some of the power needs for other cities. FMPA generates electricity using various fuel types, including natural gas, coal, nuclear and solar.
