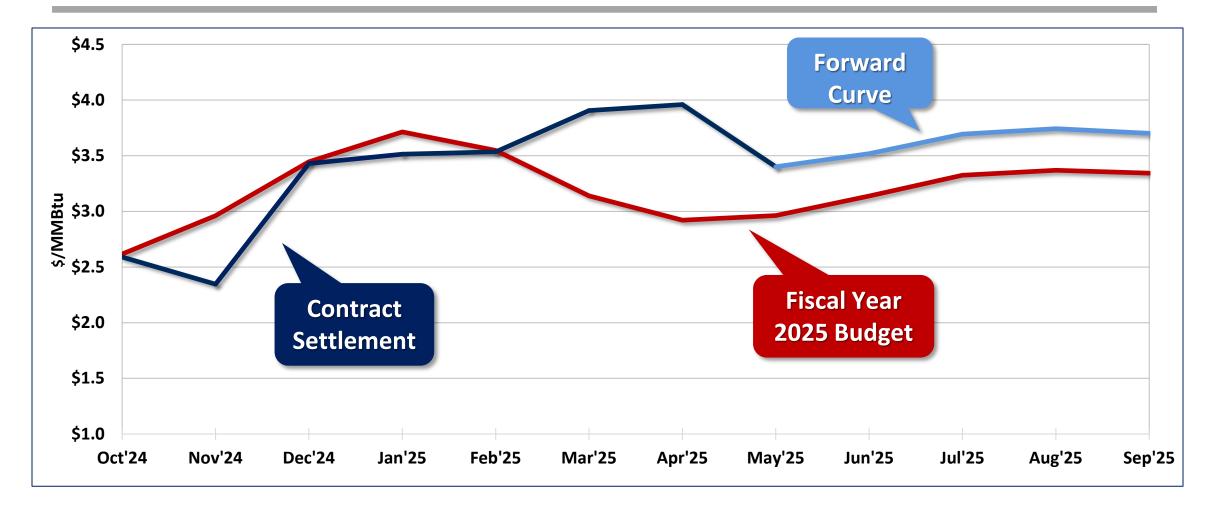

Gas Prices Down by 14% Due to Market Volatility

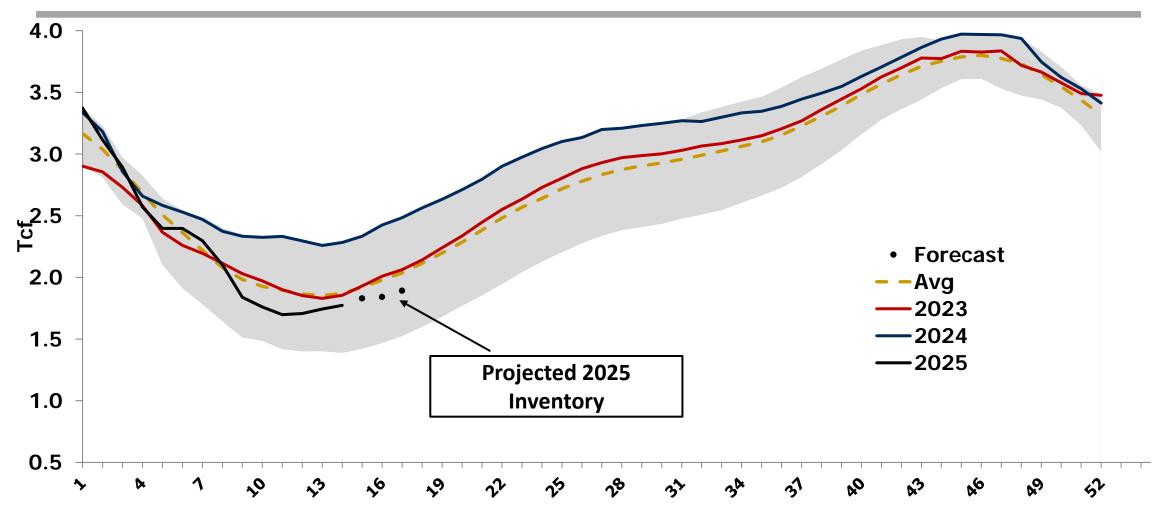
Forward Natural Gas Curve as of April 9th





Gas Storage 489 Bcf Below Last Year

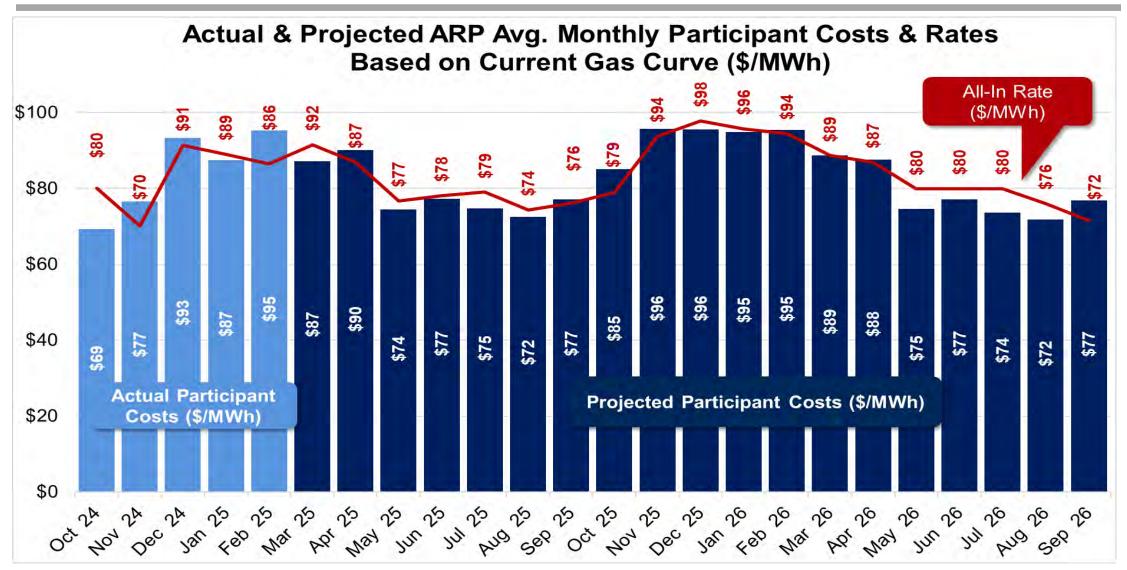
Coldest Jan. in 28 Years Eroded Storage Levels, Spring Refill Likely Faster





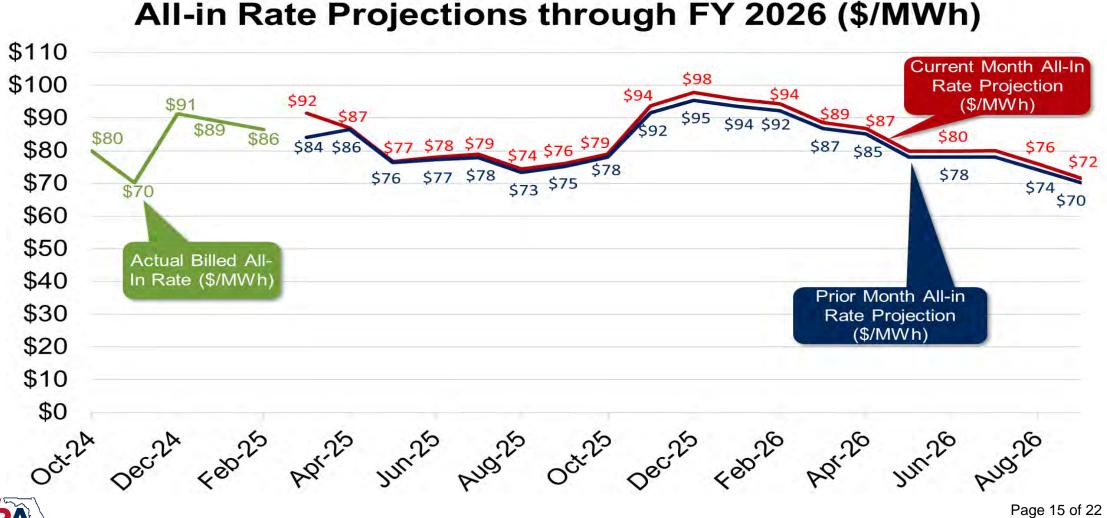
